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* "A Tribute to Sir Edward Bullard" was, in fact, written word-for-word by Sir Edward Bullard. I had just completed the presentation of the Maurice Ewing Medal to Sir Edward (155d) when I was asked to write the dedication to Sir Edward of the AIP Conference Proceedings (155b). I was in no mood to do so, and asked Teddy whether he would enjoy writing about himself what *he* thought ought to be said; it was to remain forever a secret. Teddy wrote a delightful account of his career, full of glimpses such as returning from the War and finding his Cambridge laboratory in shambles: "his first task was to scrub the floor". The manuscript was returned to me by the editors with the above quote and many others deleted. Upon protesting, I was told that Sir Edward would be gravely offended. I persisted. Teddy was so delighted with the dedication that he spilled the beans.

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
